medical and psychosocial factors contributing to family indirect cost outcomes of asthma in low-income, urban African American children with asthma and their families.

Aims: Data were collected and analyzed to investigate medical factors (asthma morbidity, medication adherence, and environmental tobacco smoke) and psychosocial factors (child depression, child hopelessness, child externalizing behavior problems, and family social support) contributing to family indirect cost outcomes for asthma. A qualitative investigation of the caregiver's assessment of indirect costs on the family due to the target child's asthma was also implemented.

Findings: Asthma morbidity was the greatest predictor of family indirect costs. Asthma impacts the entire family unit, not only the child with asthma. It requires a systemic, multi-disciplinary team approach (medicine, public health, mental health) to mediate the adverse indirect costs of asthma on the family.
